

Did *you* KNOW?

Soft water

BJWSA's water is very soft, eliminating the need for many aspects of home water filtration.

Do you really need a household water filter?

BJWSA uses phosphates as a corrosion inhibitor, which could cause your filter to clog quickly.

Public water systems commonly add phosphates to the drinking water as a corrosion inhibitor to prevent the leaching of lead and copper from pipes and fixtures. SCDHEC requires that all public water systems maintain corrosion control, and will always be part of our process.

BJWSA's water is very soft, eliminating the need for many aspects of home water filtration. Filters for a "point of use" system last longer than a "point of entry" system. You may want to consider using a filter only at the point of use.

Remember: a home filtration system filter may not last as long as the manufacturer advertises, and may turn brown because of the corrosion inhibitors– but the water is still safe to drink!
